

***Southerly* Submission Guidelines**

- *Southerly* is a peer-reviewed journal devoted to Australian literature, published once a year.
- *Southerly* puts out Calls for Submissions for particular, themed issues. Unfortunately, due to a precarious funding environment, we are unable to accept un-themed, unsolicited submissions.
- We accept literary fiction and literary creative nonfiction including personal and lyric essays (up to 3000 words) and poetry (up to 5 pages) linked to each themed issue.
- We accept scholarly essays (up to 5000 words) on Australian literature and linked to each themed issue. Any scholarly essays not demonstrably on Australian literature cannot be considered.
- We use the MLA system and prefer endnotes to footnotes.
- We do not accept full manuscripts of books or genre fiction (i.e. science fiction, horror, fantasy, romance).
- We only accept material that has not been published in any form.
- We only accept work from Australian and New Zealand authors, or residents of Australia.
- *Southerly* has first serial rights only. After publication, rights revert to the author.
- All work published is archived and made available through the Informit Literature and Culture Collection online. If you do not want your work available here, you must opt out.
